New EYFS

The Statutory Framework sets out what Early Years Providers Must do to keep your children safe, happy and engaged.

There has been a recent update to the way the current Early Years Curriculum works. Previously there was alot of paperwork and we had to track the children across multiple age bands which was time consuming and took us away from the children.

The new Framework focuses on Quality Interactions with children which we have thousands of, but it avoids unnecessary paperwork. It enables us to capture learning experiences in the moment and spend more time enhancing your child's learning.

Please bring in a piece of fruit for sharing at least once per week.

Please be on time so we can share with you about your child's day and clean up ready for other users.

Tapestry

Prior to the changes we used Tapestry to share photos, links to the area of development and you would see the age or stage your child was at.

We may share a photo of your child mark making and we would write which hand and grip your child was using. This can be seen from the photo so there is now no need to write it down if the picture is obvious but we still share photo's.

Photos will still be shared on Tapestry and used for you to see the activities your children enjoy doing. Staff will use them for a memory jog so that we can write a report for your child between 2yrs-3yrs known as a 2-3 year check. This is different to the Ages and Stages questionnaire and the check at 2years your child should have with a Health Visitor.

Rather than tracking children between age brackets we use our knowledge of child development, supportive tools and our environment to ensure your child is where they should be. If we have any concerns over your child's development we will always speak to you. This is now known as a flag or checkpoint. This may be something like a speech delay, behavioural concern, physical delay but we will always share our concerns with you if we have any.

Tapestry is a 2way communicative tool and we love to see you sharing photos of your child's experiences at home especially when they achieve something new or have had a special experience.

We will also speak to you 1to 1 3 times per year to discuss your child's progress. This is usually on term 2, 4 and 6.
